- Covers ~30% of your overall in-state tuition (12 out of 42 credits)

## **Merit Scholarship**

- Covers ~25% of your overall in-state tuition (9 out of 42 credits)
- Minimum GPA 3.3
- No additional application



## **Funding Opportunities - MPH**

## Molina Scholarship for Health Equity

- \$1250 per semester for four consecutive semesters (\$5,000 total)
- Must reside in New York and be first-time graduate degree candidates.
- Must have experience working in Latino communities in the U.S., be fluent in Spanish, and demonstrate their commitment to working towards health equity for Latinos.
- Supplemental application



## **Funding Opportunities - MS**

## National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) Scholarship

- At least 24 credits of in-state tuition reimbursement.
- Minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0.
- Considerations will be given to promising applicants that are currently working in the field.
- All applicants must have completed at least 40 credit hours in the following courses: biology, chemistry, health sciences, mathematics, statistics, physics, or engineering prior to admission



## **Funding Opportunities - MS**

## National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences Research Assistantship

- Full coverage of in-state tuition. In addition to tuition reimbursement, we will provide five graduate assistantships per year (approximately \$20,000) for students to work with faculty mentors in the research areas of sensor technology development and validation
- Eligibility is restricted to U.S. citizens or permanent residents who are prepared to work part time with a faculty mentor

## **MPH Admission Requirements**



- Apply online via the Schools of Public Health Application Services (SOPHAS)
   (SOPHAS http://www.sophas.org)
- B.S., B.A., or equivalent from an accredited U.S. institution or recognized international institution (120 hours of college credit) with 3 hours minimum each of college math, and biology. Official transcripts must be provided.
- Cumulative GPA of 2.85 on a 4.0 scale
- GRE not required
- Submit a 750 word personal statement
- Three (3) letters of reference (1/3 must be from previous professors, 2/3 can be from another professor, academic advisor or mentor, employer, or community/volunteer service supervisor)
- 30 hours of community service are also required
- Deadline: July 1





## **DrPH Admission Requirements**



- Apply online via the Schools of Public Health Application Services (SOPHAS)
   (SOPHAS http://www.sophas.org) Choose <u>one</u> concentration.
- Cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale in prior graduate work
- Applicants must have one of the following from a CEPH accredited school/program: Master of Public Health degree, an equivalent degree with similar core MPH coursework, or a terminal degree. Official transcripts must be sent directly to SOPHAS from all colleges/universities attended.
- Submit a 750-word personal statement describing how the DrPH program aligns with the applicant's life, educational, and career goals
- Three (3) letters of reference (1/3 must be from current or previous professor, 2/3 can be from another professor, employer, or colleague)
- Applicants are required to have one year minimum of public health or public health-related practical experience. <u>GRE scores are not required</u> (SOPHAS 0127).
- Current resume/CV
- Deadline: October 1



- > We are the only public health college or program in the country in partnership with a state health department (a 40-year partnership), which provides direct access to public health professionals and leaders in the field, databases, hands-on experience, research facilities, real-world collaboration, and professional networking opportunities.



### **The Albany Advantage**

- The AI Plus Institute at the University at Albany is a leading center for cutting-edge artificial intelligence (AI) research, education and collaboration. AI is embedded into every discipline.
- The Center for the Elimination of Minority Health Disparities (CEMHD) at the University at Albany is a collaborative effort focused on minority health disparities in New York's smaller cities and towns. The director of the Center is a CIHS faculty member.



### **Unmatched Internship Experience**

- > MPH students complete 720 hours of internship experience (nation-wide average is 300 hours) in two different settings. Internship director assists with internship matching.
- Internships are available in government, state and local health departments, private sector, not-for-profit, community based, healthcare, pharmaceutical, and international settings. 70-80% of our internships are paid. 34% of internships lead to job offers at that organization.
- Networking opportunities for all students with professional and senior level staff in the New York State Department of Health lead to jobs in Albany and beyond.



### **Affordability**

> As a public research university, UAlbany costs considerably less than most private institutions.

> MPH and MS students with a 3.0 undergraduate GPA automatically receive a Dean's Merit award. \$4,000 for domestic students, \$8,000 for domestic non-residents, and \$10,000 for international students – applied in equal installments over four semesters.

### **Signature Research Strengths**

- **Biomedical Sciences** Bacterial infectious disease, vector-borne disease, structural biology, assay development for clinical diagnostics. Research conducted in Wadsworth Center, NYS Public Health Laboratory and funded by NIH grants that cover student stipends.
- **Biostatistics** Statistical theory advancement and methods in artificial intelligence, precision medicine, bioinformatics, spatiotemporal analysis, stochastic processes, and applied biostatistics.
- **Epidemiology** Applied epidemiology, infectious disease epidemiology, artificial intelligence, social epidemiology and health equity, and molecular epidemiology.



### **Signature Research Strengths**

- **Environmental Health Sciences** Air pollution, drinking water quality and health risks, climate change and extreme weather events, sustainability and green design, environmental contamination and assessment of health risks, food and consumer products, and toxicological studies of various human health outcomes.



### **Application Process**

The following application and supplementary materials must be submitted online at <a href="www.sophas.org">www.sophas.org</a>. Visit our <a href="www.sophas.org">website</a> for more detailed admissions information.

### Statement of Purpose/Personal Statement

The Statement of Purpose is a narrative that discusses an applicant's past education, experiences, and current professional career objectives. The limit is 1,500 words.

### Curriculum Vitae or Resume

All applicants must submit a complete, up-to-date CV/resume that includes all previous and current employment, activities, leadership positions, community service, research, education and academic or professional awards or honors.

## Letters of Recommendation (3 required)

All applicants are required to submit a minimum of three letters of recommendation from professionals who are best able to assess their ability to be successful in a graduate degree program. Ideally, recommenders are recent professors, researcher mentors, professionals or employers in a related field.

## Official Transcript(s) from all institutions attended

All official academic records including degree and certificate programs, English language programs, and incomplete coursework/degrees from all previously attended colleges and universities must be sent directly to SOPHAS for verification.

GRE is only required the PhD in Biostatistics and the PhD in Epidemiology programs.

### **International Applicants**

- All non-U.S. transcripts must be evaluated by the World Education Service (WES) using the ICAP Course-by-Course evaluation service.
- Applicants are required to mail an additional complete set of all official transcript(s) and a photocopy of the diploma(s).
- English Proficiency Exam is required.
  - TOEFL minimum score of 80.
  - o IELTS minimum score of 6.5.
  - Duolingo minimum score of 124
- As STEM classified degrees, international students are granted a total of three years optional practice training (OPT) to establish their career in the United States upon graduation.







  - Transcripts from ALL institutions attended
    - For international transcripts, an evaluation through WES, TEC, or another NACES organization will be required. This can be completed through SOPHAS.
  - 3 Letters of Recommendation
  - Personal Statement Essay
  - Resume
  - Video Interview through Kira Talent.
    - This can be completed after the application has been submitted.

### **Financial Aid**

       Your essay should be 2-3 pages, single-spaced (1500 words maximum), and specifically tailored to your application for Washington University in St. Louis.
