Admission Criteria

- No specific undergraduate major is required.
- 3.0 minimum undergraduate GPA
- Good analytical and communication skills
- TOEFL (79), IELTS (7.0), Duolingo (120) scores for international students
- Public health or health administration experience preferred





Application Process

A completed application includes:

- Official transcripts from all previous or current college coursework
- Three letters of recommendation
- Personal Statement
- Resume or CV
- Ohio State University Supplemental Application*

International applicants add:

- Official transcripts & translations or WES evaluation
- Unofficial copies of international transcripts accepted only for admissions review.
- TOEFL, IELTS, DuoLingo scores

In recognition of the significant, increasing demand for public health professionals in the US caused by an aging population and a growing emphasis on health promotion and preventative care, as well as the potential challenges from the termination of the Grad PLUS loan in July 2026, **University of Puget Sound is aiming to make its high quality, transdisciplinary Master of Public Health program more accessible and affordable** to a greater number of prospective students by introducing **an expanded academic scholarship**

How to Qualify

As part of the admission review process, new students applying to start in the MPH program for the fall semester of 2026 will be automatically evaluated for an academic scholarship disbursed across two years of study. Students admitted to the program will also receive information of their merit scholarship offer and its terms at the time of acceptance.

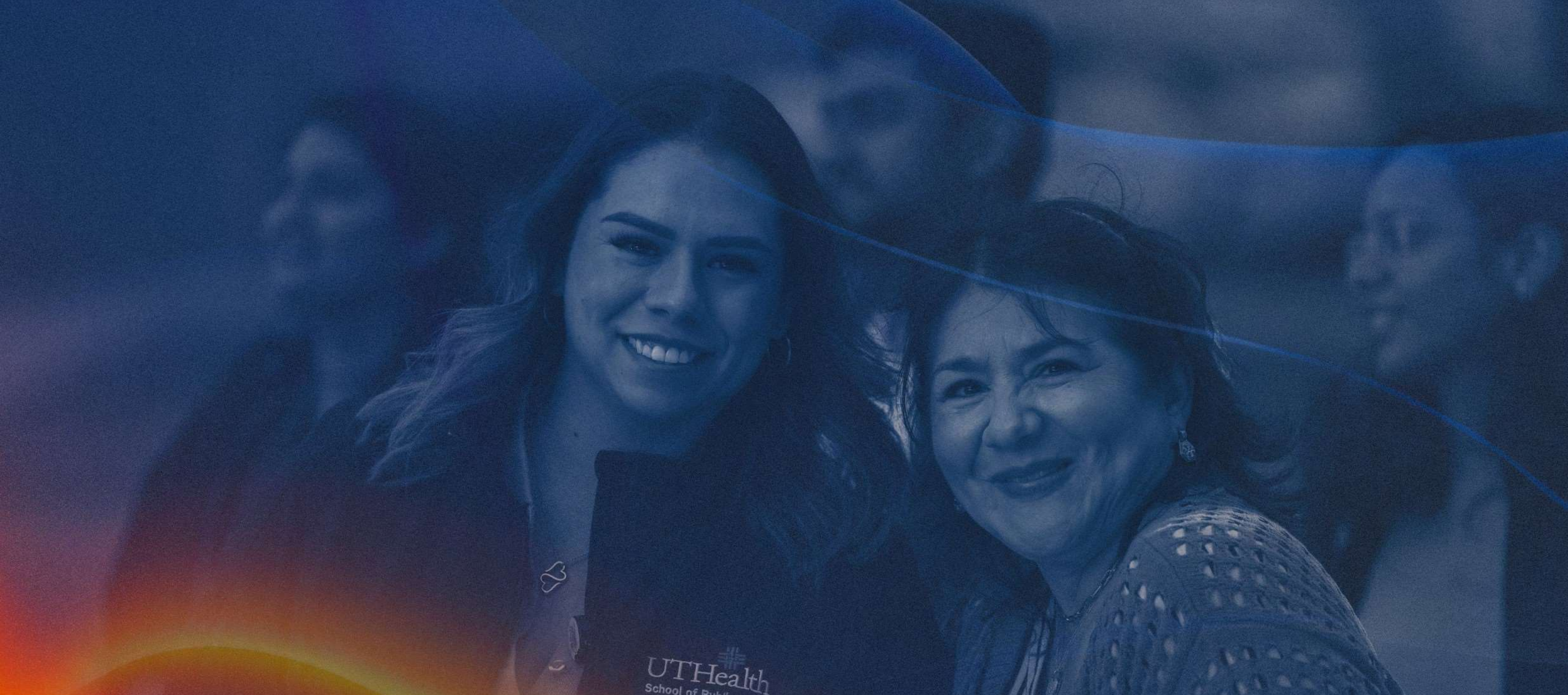

Areas of Study

BIOSTATISTICS & DATA SCIENCE

Provides training in research design, basic statistical theory, data analysis, computer applications, and statistical consultation.

Graduates of the program are prepared to assume statistical posts in government, private health agencies, or in health research programs. The program emphasizes fundamental statistical theory and methods and provides the basis for doctoral level biostatistical studies.

ENVIRONMENTAL & OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH SCIENCES

Provides a foundation in environmental and occupational health sciences, in addition to the skills needed to function as a practitioner in a variety of public health settings. Students are prepared to assume positions in public health practice in government or the private sector.

EPIDEMIOLOGY DEPARTMENT

Provides a breadth of achievement in the five core disciplines of public health, as well as additional knowledge and skills in epidemiology. The goal of this program is to prepare students to put epidemiologic concepts and methods into public health practice, contribute to research studies in public health, and interpret scientific evidence relevant to public health.

HEALTH PROMOTION & BEHAVIORAL SCIENCES

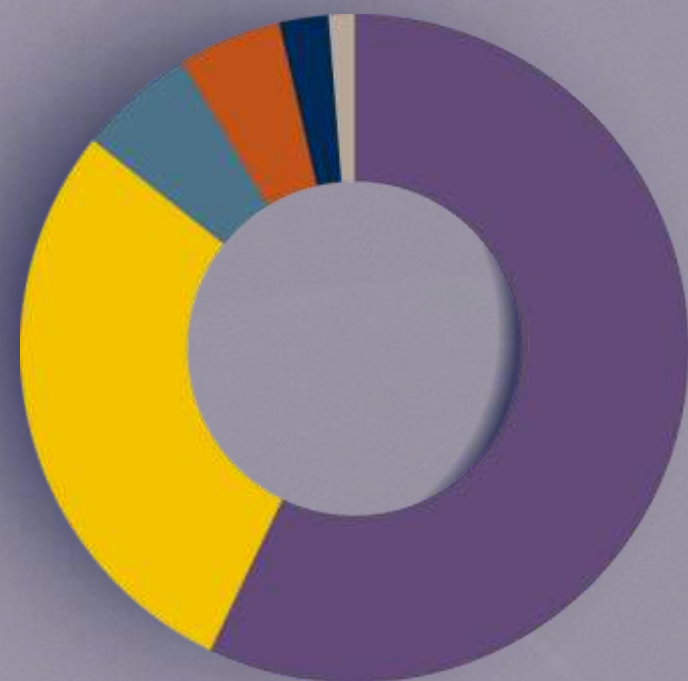
Integrates the core public health disciplines with behavioral and social sciences. The curriculum emphasizes intervention methods for health promotion development and evaluation in a variety of settings.

For **full-time students**, tuition is charged at a flat rate. Full-time students pay the same amount whether they take 8 credit hours or 18 credit hours.

Part-time students are charged tuition at a per-credit-hour rate of \$1,839.

Funding your MPH degree

Funding opportunities include:

- **MPH David Satcher Public Health Scholars Program** supports individuals from under-represented racial, ethnic, and economically disadvantaged backgrounds *(no separate application needed)*
- **MPH Goldberger and Alumni Scholarships** support incoming students from all backgrounds *(no separate application needed)*
- **Federal loans** are available to all U.S. students who submit a FAFSA
- **Graduate assistantships and part-time employment**
Nearly all MPH students work in positions in the community or on campus, many on public health-related projects with faculty members
- **External scholarships**
Start with the list on the MPH website under *Admissions*, then research additional opportunities that match your unique background and interests

Eligibility Requirements *(all tracks)*
