





Funding Support



Scholarships

- A limited number of school/departmental scholarship awards are issued to incoming graduate students each year, typically ranging from \$1,000 – \$4,000.
- Scholarship applications are reviewed on a rolling basis for <u>admitted students</u> only. For the best chance of award consideration, apply early.
- The <u>Texas A&M SPH General Scholarship Application</u> is embedded within the SOPHAS application (no separate application process is necessary for award consideration).

Graduate Assistantships

- Available on a limited basis and offered at the discretion of each academic department based on fit, need, and funding availability.
- Not typically awarded to incoming first year master's students. More common for master's students to be employed in these positions during their second year.
- Admitted doctoral students do tend to be prioritized for these type of funding sources.





- Statement of Purpose

 - (3) required for MPH, MHA Resident track, DrPH, PhD
 - > (2) required for Executive MHA
- Writing Sample (Doctoral applicants only)
- Official English Language Proficiency test scores (international applicants only)


