ASPPH/CDC Governmental Public Health Applied Practice Experience Program Program Announcement

Project Background

An Applied Practice Experience (APE), often called a practicum, is a required component of Master of Public Health (MPH) education at Council on Education for Public Health (CEPH)-accredited schools and programs. Through an APE, students apply the knowledge and skills acquired through their coursework in a real-world public health setting while demonstrating public health competencies through practical work products developed for the benefit of a host organization. The APE provides students with an opportunity to strengthen professional skills, expand professional networks, explore potential career paths, and contribute to meaningful public health projects.

Through the ASPPH/CDC Governmental Public Health Applied Practice Experience Program, students are placed with state, Tribal, local, and territorial (STLT) health departments that protect and improve the health of communities across the United States. Students work alongside governmental public health professionals to address real-world public health challenges while contributing to the mission and priorities of their host health department. In doing so, students gain firsthand exposure to governmental public health practice, including efforts to prevent disease, respond to public health emergencies, analyze and use data, engage communities, and address the factors that influence population health.

Program Overview

The ASPPH/CDC Governmental Public Health Applied Practice Experience Program is a collaborative initiative between the Association of Schools and Programs of Public Health (ASPPH) and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). The program connects students from CEPH-accredited schools and programs of public health with governmental public health departments for structured, competency-based APE. Through mentored, project-based placements at select state, Tribal, local, and territorial health departments, students gain hands-on experience in governmental public health practice while contributing to meaningful public health initiatives.

Placements emphasize public health leadership and data science competencies developed collaboratively by ASPPH and subject matter experts through the [CDC Public Health Leadership and Education, Advancing Health Equity and Data Science \(PH-LEADS\)](#) initiative. Students may contribute to projects related to strategic planning, workforce development, quality improvement, accreditation readiness, community health assessment, program evaluation, organizational effectiveness, and other leadership-focused initiatives.

ASPPH manages the ASPPH/CDC Governmental Public Health Applied Practice Experience Program from start to finish. ASPPH recruits and onboards participating health department host sites, administers the student application and selection process, coordinates placements, delivers student orientation and program support, disburses stipend payments, monitors student progress, facilitates performance and assessment activities, and serves as the primary point of contact for students, academic institutions, and host sites throughout the experience. By coordinating all aspects of program implementation, ASPPH ensures that APE placements are meaningful and aligned with both educational requirements and host site workforce development needs.

Eligibility

To be eligible for the ASPPH/CDC Governmental Public Health Applied Practice Experience Program, students must be enrolled in an [ASPPH member school or program](#) that is CEPH-accredited (Master's or Doctoral-level) and be in good academic standing. Students must also be U.S. citizens or hold a visa permitting lawful permanent residence ("Green Card") in the U.S. Student visas are not accepted.

Period of Performance

The program will be offered through two distinct four-month cohorts during the 2026–2027 academic year:

- **Fall 2026 Cohort:** APE placements will begin in September 2026.
- **Spring 2027 Cohort:** APE placements will begin in February 2027.

Each APE placement will require the completion of 200 hours of applied public health practice, unless more than 200 hours is required by the student's institution. Individual APE schedules will be developed in coordination with host site preceptors and the student's academic and/or APE advisor to ensure alignment with academic requirements and host site needs. ASPPH will place up to six students in up to six host sites for the Fall 2026 Cohort.

Location

Placements will be based in state, Tribal, local, and territorial governmental public health departments across the United States. All placements will be virtual, unless the student is already located near their host site and the student, host site, and ASPPH agree to an in-person or hybrid placement. Relocation expenses will not be reimbursed.

Stipend and Allowances

The training stipend for APE placements is \$3,000. The training stipend is intended to assist with personal living expenses.

Applied Practice Experience Placements

While placed at their host site, students will work on meaningful, project-based initiatives that support health department priorities while developing leadership skills and gaining experience in governmental public health practice.

Projects will emphasize public health leadership and data science competencies curated by ASPPH and subject matter experts through the CDC PH-LEADS initiative. These competencies focus on strengthening leadership capacity, systems thinking, organizational effectiveness, collaboration, and data-informed decision-making within governmental public health departments. Placement projects may include activities such as strategic planning, program evaluation, quality improvement, community health assessment, workforce development, accreditation readiness, data analysis, or other initiatives that advance health department priorities.

Each placement will include at least one deliverable, such as a report, presentation, dashboard, toolkit, assessment, or other product identified by the host site. Students will be paired with a health department

preceptor who will provide mentorship and professional guidance throughout the placement, helping students achieve project goals while gaining insight into governmental public health practice.

Application Instructions

- Applications must be submitted using the [ASPPH Applied Learning and Training Programs Online Application System](#), a centralized application service that provides a secure, easy, and convenient way for students/graduates of ASPPH member schools and public health programs to apply to all ASPPH Applied Learning and Training Programs.
- To begin the online application, click the "Sign Up" button below the Login button to create a password-protected account. If the student already has an account, they may log in on this page. Students are advised to carefully read the instructions that appear throughout the online application system.
- After submitting an application, students may make edits at any time before the application deadline by clicking the pencil icon in the "My Status" section. If the application is edited, the student must resubmit it by the deadline; otherwise, the application will not be reviewed. Applications are reviewed only after the online application deadline has passed.

Review and Final Selection

ASPPH will facilitate the student recruitment, selection, and placement process in collaboration with participating state, Tribal, local, and territorial health department host sites. ASPPH works with host sites to define APE project scope, desired deliverables, and preferred candidate qualifications.

A group of qualified student applicants will be shared with health department host sites for final review and selection. Participating health departments will conduct final interviews and select the APE student who best

aligns with their project needs. ASPPH will support the onboarding process and coordinate with the student, host site preceptor, and student's academic advisor to ensure the APE experience is established with clearly defined project objectives and tasks, timelines, learning objectives, and meets the APE requirements of the student's academic institution.
