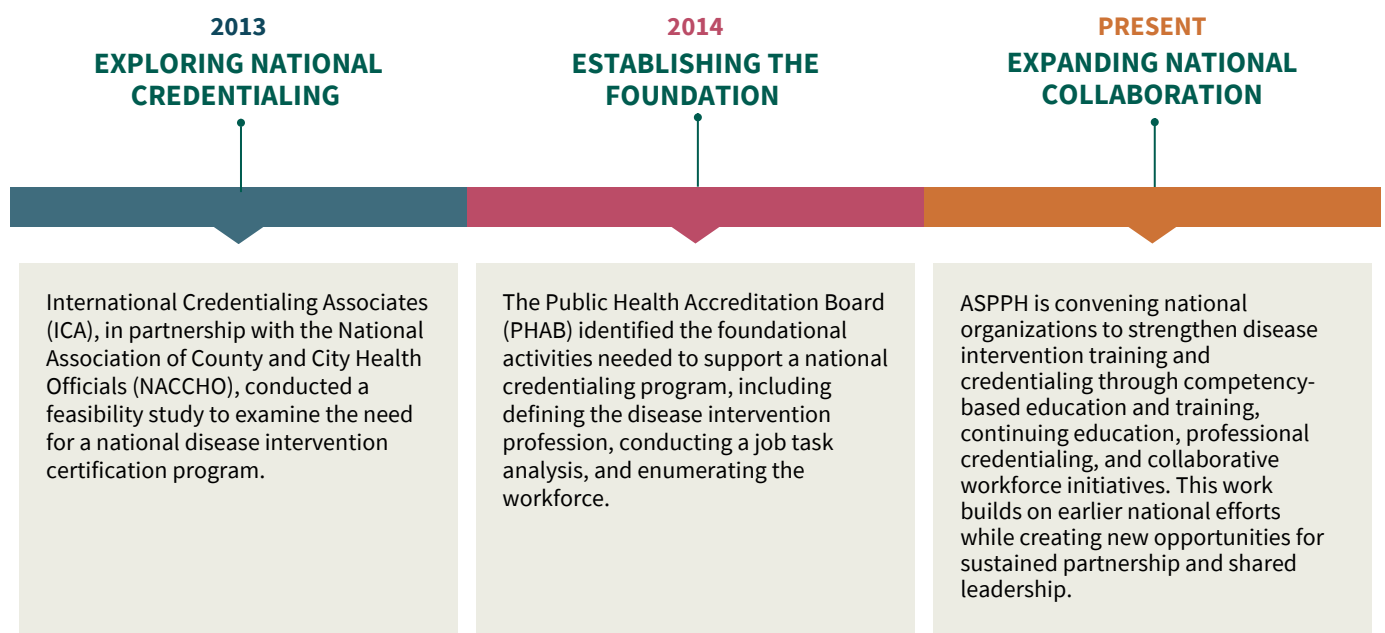
## Advancing Disease Intervention Training and Credentialing Through National Partnership

Disease intervention professionals are essential members of the nation's public health workforce, reducing the spread of infectious diseases through contact tracing, partner services, health education, and facilitating access to health care. Preparing this workforce requires coordinated leadership in education, training, and credentialing.

Supported by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the Association of Schools and Programs of Public Health (ASPPH) is partnering with national organizations to strengthen disease intervention training and credentialing through a collaborative national approach. The National Network for Disease Intervention Training and Credentialing (NNDITC) provides a forum for organizations to share expertise, identify emerging needs, and collaboratively advance the preparation and professional development of the disease intervention workforce.

## Advancing Training and Credentialing

The NNDITC is advancing disease intervention training and credentialing through national collaborations that identify emerging workforce needs, align priorities, and leverage partner networks to expand the reach and impact of resources for the disease intervention workforce.

### Working together, national partners have:



- Conducted a national environmental scan of the disease intervention workforce.
- Updated the disease intervention job task analysis.
- Advanced competency-based education and training pathways.
- Developed continuing education resources that support lifelong professional learning.
- Established the Certified in Disease Intervention (CDI) examination and certification program.
- Identified priorities for strengthening disease intervention training and credentialing.
- Informed innovative initiatives, including [UniversiDI](#).
- Created a sustainable national partnership model to support continued collaboration.
